Why the Name White Pine?

The White Pine (*Pinus Strobus*) is a native tree to Minnesota and serves as a symbol of what we are about. Officially known as the Eastern White Pine, the trees have a vigorous growth rate and the high quality wood make it a preferred choice for lumber. Sometimes called the monarch of the forest, tree trunks can reach six feet in diameter, and soar to a height of over 250 feet. In the pioneer days, tree trunks from White Pines harvested in the eastern part of the U.S. were the preferred choice for the masts of the majestic sailing ships due to their tall, straight and strong trunks. The trees were heavily logged in the early years of Minnesota's development, and recently the [DNR](#) has begun a major replanting program for White Pines.
